


NEW MATERIAL APRIL 2022



30th July 1958. First Day Cover of the Importance of Health issue 5c stamp with nurse's head and 'Health Guards the Nation' slogan. From Saskatoon to Saskatoon on envelope commemorating with Anniversary of the Canadian Nurses Association. £1.50



24th September 1951. First Day Cover of the Centenary of the Postal Service 'CAPEX' set of 4, posted from Montreal to Kingston, Jamaica on airmail envelope illustrated with a fossil from the Devonian period 300 million years old and 'That's a long time to be dead!' humorous statement. Slight nick out one corner of the envelope. £7.50





MR. V. AMOS. 26 PRIORY LAND. DUNFERMLINE SCOTLAND.

30th December 1943: Blind postmark without sign of provenance. Airmail cover to Scotland with 7c deep blue Aeroplane stamp. £2.00 $\footnote{3}$



7th June 1941: Hamilton & Owen Sound Railway Post Office. Single HAM & O'SOUND RPO' ostmark. 1937 3c dark carmine George VI stamp. No transit or receiving marks.

In AB Jardine & Co machinists etc commercial cover. £2.00



20th April 1937: Stoneham Quebec to Toronto. Registered Cover, On front: STONEHAM registered mark, Stoneham, Que., Quebec, PQ and Notre Dame + ? postmarks. On back: **Montreal & Toronto**Railway Post Office post mark with TORONTO ONT REG.DIV.TERMINAL 'A' APR 22 37, TORONTO
ONT. POSTAL STATION D AP 22 37 marks, as well as 2 x Stoneham marks.

On THE GOLD MEDAL PEOPLE LTD commercial orange cover with 1937 3c dark carmine George VI and 10c carmine rose Mountie stamps. £2.50



9th April 1937: Lakefield Ontario to Toronto. Registered cover. On front: LAKEFIELD registered mark. In back: **Bell Prince Edward Island and Toronto Railway Post Office** postmark with TORONTO ONT EG.DIV.TERMINAL 'A' APR 20 37, TORONTO ONT. POSTAL STATION D AP 20 37 marks, as well as akefield marks.

27th March 1937: West Glassville New Brunswick to Toronto. Registered cover. On front: WEST GLASSVILLE registered mark. On back: Saint John & Edmunston Railway Post Office postmark with SRISTOL, N.B transit mark TORONTO ONT REG.DIV.TERMINAL 'A' MR 29 27 and TORONTO ONT. POSTAL STATION? MR 29 37 receiving mark, as well as West Glassville marks. On THE GOLD MEDAL PEOPLE LTD commercial orange cover with 1935 3c dark carmine George V and 10c carmine rose Mountie stamps. £2.50



 $^{\rm st}$ June 1935. First Day Cover to England with 1c green and 2c brown George V definitives with Dttawa Canada 13 Jun 1 35' postmark £3.00 \mathcal{IH} 8



own on envelope and postmarked ELK LAKE OC 9 34 and a red postmark hard to decipher but SIMPSON', 'OCT 10' 'DISTRIBUTION' and a clock face can be made out. £2.50



11th April 1917: Canadian Forces First World War stampless cover with circular postmark 'FIELD POST OFFICE 11 AP 17' to Liverpool redirected to Southport with MOSSLEY HILL LIVERPOOL circular receiving postmark '9.15am 14 AP 17' and oval red mark '? FIELD CENSOR 2715' and crown in the centre. Crease down left side and slightly dog-eared. £1.00



7th May 1930: Letter from the Canadian House of Commons to England with 2c Green Scroll issue of George V. Circular postmark '21 MY MAY 7 1930 HOUSE OF COMMONS – CHAMBRE DES COMMUNES CANADA'. On back, postmarked Ottawa 9^{PM} May 7 1930 and wavy bars cancel. Slight creases. £1.50



3rd December 1958: OHMS/SSM Department of National Health & Welfare manilla cover from Edmonton Terminal Alberta to Old Crow Yukon. Machine cancel with the slogan MAIL EARLY FOR CHRISTMAS on 5c blue Wilding stamp. Slight crease and tear in the envelope. £1..2\$
